Congregational Spiritual Practice: Blessing

Our next Congregational Spiritual Practice is Blessing. In the Old Testament, *barak* is the Hebrew word most often translated “blessing.” *Barak* is used 412 times in reference to the act of blessing, so this practice is clearly very important to God.

According to the Bible dictionary, “to bless” means “to endue with power for success, prosperity, fertility, longevity, etc.” God is the only *source* of blessing but “blessings are pronounced on children or subordinates by heads of households or others in authority.” In other words, God provides the power and is responsible for the results of spoken blessings, but human beings are the channels or instruments of these blessings.

The Hebrew understanding of blessing has been largely lost to us as Christians. Nowadays, we tend to equate blessings with good gifts of God, with a polite phrase to use after someone sneezes, or with prayers at mealtime. Over the next weeks, we at Gingrichs will reclaim together the traditional Judeo-Christian understanding and practice of Blessing.

Every week, you will be hearing a different scriptural blessing spoken to you by clicking on the link provided at the end of each week’s email. Click and hear the blessing as often as you like. Be sure to also deliberately pause to not just hear but to actively *receive* this blessing from God.

Because of our High Priest Jesus Christ, we are now a “priesthood of all believers,” authorized to speak God’s blessings from Scripture to each other. Hopefully, after a week of hearing this blessing spoken to you at least once a day, you will be ready to be the conduit of God’s blessing by speaking this same blessing to someone else.

Thanks to Francis Maust for speaking over us this week the following blessing from Numbers 6:23-26:

The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face shine upon you and be gracious to you; the Lord lift up his countenance upon you and give you peace.
